

Post Graduate Year 1 Pharmacy Residency St. Vincent Hospitals and Health Services

The St. Vincent Post Graduate Year 1 Residency (PGY1) is a one-year commitment designed to provide post-graduate practical experience in the provision of pharmaceutical care. Through these experiences, the resident is provided the opportunity to develop himself or herself as a pharmacy practitioner. Our goal is to train each resident to be a competent and confident provider of comprehensive pharmaceutical care. The resident will demonstrate the ability to manage patient care and achieve optimal drug therapy outcomes. He or she will be accountable for providing education to other health care professionals and patients through a multitude of educational opportunities. Throughout the residency experience, each resident will develop individual and professional skills that result in a highly marketable clinical practitioner.

St. Vincent Indianapolis Hospital is a 500 + bed, acute care hospital and referral center. The hospital's Medical Education Department supports medical residents in Internal Medicine, Family Practice, Pediatrics, and Obstetrics/Gynecology. The Pharmacy Department has PGY2 residencies in the areas of pediatrics and primary care.
